This class is intended to be for people who do not have a history in the Christian faith or just have questions they always wanted to ask, but were afraid they might be embarrassed if they did. ALPHA starts off with dinner at 6:00pm, and anything that begins with eating must be a great class. Check it out on Wednesdays at 7:00pm. Patrick Silva is our leader and he can use you on his team.

We are also introducing a new CPR... Center Pointe Recovery. The first eight weeks beginning on September 10, will deal with alcohol and chemical dependencies. But throughout the year, CPR will address issues like Financial Recovery, Divorce Care, and Grief Recovery. CPR will meet beginning on Friday September 10 at 7:00pm in the YAC.

These are just a few new things that are happening along with a winning cast and programming that is already in progress. Thank you for being a part and helping support our mission in developing everyone to become better followers of Christ. As you share your life with others, you will find yourself growing too.

This spring, I attended a Pastor Leadership Conference and like most conferences there is a lot of information and ideas that are presented and a few of those seem to lodge deeply within you and take affect in your life. One of those for me was a very simple

thing, but profound as well. It was based on a passage from Luke 10:2... “The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest fields.” They

asked us to set an alarm on our cell phones to 10:02. And every time the alarm sounds to pray for workers. Now, every morning and every evening when my alarm sounds, I whisper a prayer that God would send laborers to his harvest fields. It’s been a great reminder that in the middle of my busyness to remember that God works through people, people like you and me who have heard His call on our hearts and have responded. But the work is greater than all of our efforts so we must be at prayer that God continues to send the right people to the right places at the right times. Would you accept my challenge to pray and set your phone alarm so you don’t forget? Remember, at 10:02 of every morning and evening, we will all join together to speak to the Father as one. I believe He will answer because He promised that whatever we asked for in accordance with His will, we would receive it. So let’s continue in prayer and in love as we follow Him.

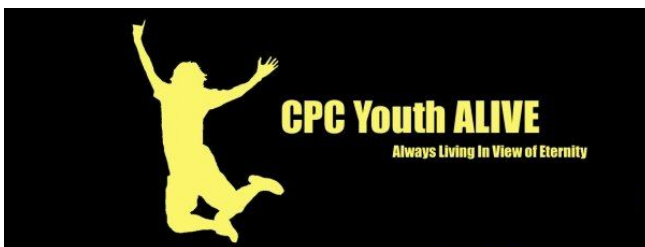
