- 2. Are you still skeptical? Why or Why not?**
- 3. What does this tells us about the confidence of Matthew in the resurrection of Jesus to admit, “but some doubted”?**

Read Acts 1:3-5

- 4. What more could Jesus have done than he already has done in order to prove that he was really resurrected?**
- 5. What more could he do for you than he has already done to prove that he is alive today?**
- 6. Are you “convinced” by the “proofs”? Why or why not?**

Revisit Acts 1:3-5

- 7. Why do you think Jesus taught them about the kingdom of God rather than the beginning of the church, which was to take place 50 days after the resurrection and only 10 days after these events in Matthew 28 and Acts 1?**
- 8. Which is more important? The kingdom of God or the Church? Or both? What is the relationship between the Kingdom of God and the Church?**
- 9. How important are the last words of Jesus here on earth? Why?**
- 10. What is the main topic of those last words? *Answer: Going and making disciples.***
- 11. Would you still be a disciple of Jesus if he were not resurrected? What difference does it make that Jesus, your Discipler, is resurrected?**
- 12. What does it mean to make a disciple?**
- 13. Are you directly involved in making a disciple? If “Yes”, how?**
- 14. How does church help us in making disciples? Does church ever hinder us from making disciples? If “Yes”, how?**
